

VILLAGE OF PORT MCNEILL

BY-LAW NO. 184

A By-law of the Village of Port McNeill (hereinafter called the "Village") to authorize the installation of culverts for the purpose of drainage of private property and boulevards and the charging of costs thereof.

WHEREAS the Council is empowered under Section 514.1.d. of the Municipal Act to regulate access to and from highways for any parcel of land abutting thereon;

AND WHEREAS the Council deems it expedient to install or permit the installation of culverts for the purpose of drainage to allow for such access;

AND WHEREAS property owners are deriving benefit from the installation of such culverts on boulevards adjacent to their property;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Village of Port McNeill, in open meeting assembled, enacts as follows:


1. On application from a property owner for the installation of a culvert to allow access to his property from any highway the Village may install a culvert or may permit the property owner to install a culvert.
2. That all culverts to be installed be of a minimum length of six metres (6 m.), of a minimum diameter of forty-five centimetres (45 cm.) and that the culvert be covered with gravel to a depth of fifteen centimetres (15 cm.) such coverage not to extend beyond one metre (1m.) from each end of the culvert. No culvert shall be of such a length that it will extend the entire length of the frontage of a lot. Each frontage must have a minimum of one-half metre ($\frac{1}{2}$ m.) in length not culverted.
3. The Village may accept and be responsible for the cost of installing the culvert.
4. The property owner shall pay in advance to the Village the actual cost of the material supplied by the Village for the installation of such culvert but it should be noted that it is not the normal policy of Council to carry a supply of culverts.
5. The installation of the culvert shall be under the supervision of the Municipal Engineer or an officer duly authorized by the Council.
6. When, in the opinion of the Municipal Engineer or authorized officer, culverts presently in use are inadequate, or where no culverts exist but are deemed necessary, such culverts may be replaced or installed and the owners of property given access by such culvert shall pay to the Village the cost of materials involved therein, as set out in Paragraph 4 of this by-law.
7. No culverts shall be installed within the boundaries of the Village except by the Village, or to the specifications of the Municipal Engineer, and pursuant to the regulations of this by-law.
8. By-law No.13 cited as "Culvert Installation By-law No. 13, 1967" is hereby repealed.
9. By-law No. 99 cited as the "Village of Port McNeill Culvert Installation Amendment By-law No. 99, 1973", is hereby repealed.
10. This By-law may be cited as the "Culvert Installation By-law No.184, 1978".
