
As we head into the Christmas season, please remember to be patient with one another. We have all had so many stresses these past few years, being kind is the very best thing we can do for one another.



Danger Trees

Over the past few years, trees were planted for many reasons including privacy, sound dampening, landscaping and protection from the weather. However, as the town ages, these trees continue to grow and as is often the case the larger they become the more damage they can cause. The root systems can get into perimeter drainage when they are planted too close to buildings, causing damage and eventually plugging the lines which in turn could flood the property. Root systems also damage driveways and concrete foundations.

On town property constant attention is paid to the damage that trees may cause to infrastructure such as water lines, sanitary sewer systems, storm sewer systems, roads and sidewalks. This municipal infrastructure at times runs through private property where there will be an easement in place to allow town crews access for maintenance. Care should be taken not to allow trees growing on private property to interfere with these piping systems and manholes as expensive damage and repairs could result.



“Danger trees” are becoming more of an issue as the town ages and are being addressed on an ever-increasing basis. These trees can pose a safety risk to the public and cause property damage if not controlled as necessary. Ultimately, careful consideration should be given when planting trees and good maintenance practices need to be followed regarding the trees which have been in place and are still growing or in a state of decline.
