

As we head into fall the fruit trees are ripening. Residents need to prepare to have increased interaction with bears. We would like to remind residents that at this time of year it is important to harvest your fruit trees to limit encounters with these animals. Removing attractants as much as possible is the responsibility of all residents, for everyone's safety and the safety of the bears.

Public works has put into place a management plan for the areas where we have blackberries and other food sources.

Even in non-conflict situations, it is important for residents to call in and report a sighting as it gives conservation important statistics for when there is a bigger issue. Conservation does not monitor Facebook posts, so please call in to 1-877-952-7277
