2023 Property Tax Notices

Property tax notices are typically mailed mid to late May. If you do not receive yours by early June, please contact the Town Office as some title changes do not have PO Box #'s. The due date for payment of property taxes is July 3, 2023. Keep in mind that the Town Office is closed Friday, June 30, 2023 for Canada Day.

You may pay property taxes by cash, cheque, debit or online banking in the bill payments section using the roll number on your tax notice as your account number.

You may pay property taxes with a credit card using Option Pay, see the Town's website for more information.

2023 Home Owner Grant

Homeowners now apply directly to the province using the online or telephone system. Wait to apply for the home owner grant until you receive your property tax notice.

Make sure to apply for your Home Owner Grant prior to the property tax payment deadline of July 3, 2023.

You will need your social insurance number and tax notice in order to claim a home owner grant.
