Conservation Officer Service

Remove Bear Attractants from your space. Harvest your fruit trees. put your garbage in bearproof bins, and keep camp/picnic sites attractant free.

## Responsibility.

Safety of our residents, visitors, and our wildlife is our responsibility. Always report Bear sightings.

Encountering a Black Bear in your yard. Don't run. be aggressive. be dominant and make loud noises. Bang pots and pans, or whatever you have to scare it away
